The Banquet is part of the Association's Annual Meeting and Education Seminar that will be taking place November 2nd through noon on Friday, November 4th. All interested members of the public are invited to attend.

The Association's conference theme is "Wyoming's Water – Transitions Ahead." The Wyoming State Bar has accredited the Education Seminar program (starting with a luncheon on November 3rd and continuing to noon on Friday, November 4th) for 7.0 CLE credits. Each year the WWA awards two \$1000 scholarships to the children or grandchildren of Association members who are high school seniors or students in a Wyoming college. The competition includes preparation of a 500-word essay on a topic concerning the importance of water to Wyoming's way of life.
